Our City.

Edmonton loves sports and culture. This city has a long history of hosting major events. Not only do Edmontonians come out by the thousands as spectators, they are passionate and experienced volunteers who will help you deliver something unforgettable. Edmonton is the capital of the Canadian province of Alberta. The city is located on the North Saskatchewan River in the central region of the province, an area with some of the most fertile farmland on the prairies. It is the second largest city in Alberta after Calgary, and is the hub of Canada's sixth-largest census metropolitan area.

In 2012, the city had a population of 817,498, and its census metropolitan area had a population of 1,159,869, making it the northernmost North American city with a metropolitan population over one million.

It is also home to North America's largest mall, West Edmonton Mall, home to over 800 stores and services, more than 100 eating establishments, 10 attractions including an indoor waterpark, amusement park, and ice rink, and two great hotels.

Experience first-hand North America's largest urban parkland, the continent's largest shopping and entertainment centre, and so much more - see for yourself why Trip Advisor named us one of Canada's top desti-

nations. Many events are anchored in the downtown Arts District, centred around Churchill Square (named in honour of Sir Winston Churchill). Jasper Avenue is the city's "mainstreet". It runs through downtown and the neighbourhood of Oliver until it reaches 124 Street and has most of the gay nightlife. Jasper Avenue is a major public transit route as several of Edmonton's busiest bus routes travel along it. On the south side of the river, the University district and Whyte Avenue contain theatres, concert halls, and various music venues.

Edmonton City Centre Mall is your downtown destination of choice for shopping, dining and enjoying Edmonton's urban centre. Convenient underground parking, a wide selection of stores and a trendy downtown buzz is Edmonton's premier urban shopping centre.

Summer highs can reach 35°C (96°F), and typically, summer lasts from late June until early September, and the humidity is seldom uncomfortably high. On average Edmonton receives 2,299 hours of bright sunshine per year and is one of Canada's sunniest cities. The month of August is characterized by daily highs around 23°C (73.4°F), exceeding 27°C (80.6°F) or dropping below 15°C (59°F), only one day in ten. Daily low temperatures range from 9°C (48°F) to 13°C (55.4°F), falling below 6°C (43°F) or exceeding 15°C (59°F) only one day in ten. Average rainfall in August is 69mm (2.7").



The Making Waves Swim Club and water polo team is Edmonton's masters swim club for the gay and lesbian community and their friends. Since 1999, their mission has been to promote the masters' swimming philosophy of "Fun, Fitness, Friendship & Participation" in a gay positive and supportive environment for all swimmers. The team first competed at the IGLA in Toronto in 2001, followed by other gay meets such as the Gay Games in Sydney 2002, IGLA San Francisco 2003, the 2006 World Outgames in Montreal, the Calgary North American Outgames in 2007, IGLA 2008 in Washington D.C., Copenhagen World Outgames in 2009, and IGLA 2013 in Seattle. We have supported local meets from other gay clubs such as English Bay, Different Strokes Calgary, and Downtown Swim Club in Toronto. We also compete at local meets and provincial and national Master Championships.


Jeff Chase has been a member of the Making Waves Swim Team executive for one year. As a new swimmer, Jeff has enjoyed joining a friendly and





Kinsmen Centre.

The Kinsmen Sport Centre is nestled in the Edmonton's scenic river valley, only minutes away from the downtown core. Playing host to local and world competition and training activities, the Kinsmen Sport Centre is also the primary Edmonton destination for individuals of all ages aspiring to take personal fitness to a new level. Kinsmen is located 5 minutes away from downtown Edmonton (20 minute walk) and is easily accessed by public transit. Past sporting events hosted by Edmonton include the 1978 Commonwealth Games, the 1983 World University Games (Universiade), and the 2005 World Master Games.





Hawrelak Park.

Hawrelak Park is a 68 hectare park in the river valley featuring a 5 ha. lake and open grassy areas. The park hosts several major festivals and events over the summer including the Heritage Festival, River City Shakespeare Festival, International Blues Festival, Pets in the Park, and Symphony Under the Sky. It also hosted the 2012, 2013 ITU Triathlon World Cup, and is host to the 2014 ITU Triathlon World Cup Grand Final in September 2014. In January 2013, Edmonton City Council approved an additional \$1.3-million in funding to make upgrades to Hawrelak Lake (lake draining and deepening), spectator area, improved grounds, etc. Conditions for the 2012 ITU Triathlon World Cup race were a no-wetsuit swim, air temperature 31°C (88°F), water temperature 24.2°C (75.5°F).

Hosted Dinners/Hosted Housing

On Wednesday night, members from Team Edmonton will organize hosted dinners. Team Edmonton will also help to arrange hosted housing for those with modest means. Team Edmonton is a volunteer-operated, non-profit society serving primarily members of the Gay, Lesbian, Bisexual & Transgendered communities but open to friends and supporters of GLBT community. The primary focus of Team Edmonton is to provide our membership and supporters with access to well organized and fun sporting events and other recreational activities that allow them to participate and interact in a positive social framework. Team Edmonton was formed by representatives from the GLBT sports in Edmonton in 2006 in response to better serve the needs of the community.

Currently, there are close to 30 different sports and recreational activities coordinated through Team Edmonton!

Pure Pride Party

Making Waves has partnered with Pure Pride Entertainment, based out of Edmonton to host the Saturday night closing party. Pure Pride shows have become well known throughout Canada and the US as fun, sexy, unique world class gay party experiences. Pure Pride 2013 in Edmonton was one of Canada's hottest Pride events starring RuPaul Drag Race Allstars Star JuJubee plus porn superstar Seth Knight & friends. DJs Nick Bertossi, D3VIANT, DJ Dopamine on the Main stage with classic retro music and drag numbers in the retro room.

Gay Rights

Lesbian, gay, bisexual, and transgender (LGBT) rights in Canada are the most advanced in the Americas. LGBT Canadians have most of the same legal rights as non-LGBT citizens, and are extended more legal rights than many other nations where homosexuality is legal. Since 2005, Canada has offered marriage rights nationwide to same-sex couples. Canada was the third nation in the world where same-sex marriages were legally performed (commencing in 2003 in the province of Ontario), the fourth nation in the world to perform same-sex marriages nationwide.

Social attitudes towards the LGBT community are generally positive in urban areas. Canada's LGBTpositive policies began to be implemented by former Prime Minister Pierre Elliot Trudeau during his time as federal justice minister in 1967 "there's no place for the state in the bedrooms of the nation".

Edmonton Pride Week


Edmonton's Pride week is organized by the Edmonton Pride Festival Society, a non-profit organization, many pride parades which are held at the end of their associated festival week, Edmonton Pride hosts its parade near the opening of the event, and the festival instead closes with a public brunch event hosted by the Mayor. As well, the Edmonton Pride Festival Society frequently chooses to designate community of its parade; in 2012, the parade was led by the trustees of the Edmonton Public School Board, and in 2013 the event was led by the Pride Centre of Edmonton, the city's main LGBT community centre. The 2013 festival was opened with the raising of the rainbow flag at Canadian Forces Base Edmonton, the first time in Canadian history that the flag was flown at a Canadian military base. The pride parade goes through downtown and concludes with an event at Churchill Square. An estimated 30,000 spectators turned out for the 2013 event.

Air Travel

Edmonton is a major air transportation gateway to northern Alberta and northern Canada through the Edmonton International Airport (YEG) and provides direct passenger service to over 50 destinations in the United States, Europe, Mexico, and the Caribbean. The airport is located within Leduc County, just outside of the City of Edmonton. With direct air distances from Edmonton to places such as London in Europe being shorter than to other main airports in western North America, Edmonton

The SkyShuttle

The SkyShuttle services the airport and selected stops in the city of Edmonton typically adjacent to major hotels. This service must be pre-booked by phone or online. The fare for this route is C\$18.00 one way per adult (2012).

Express service between the Edmonton International Airport and the Century Park LRT Station, facilitating connections to the region's wider transit system. Route 747 runs hourly between 4:10 a.m. and 12:00 a.m., with increased service during peak times. A one-way fare is C\$5.00 (2012).

Transit

The Edmonton Transit System (ETS) is the city's public transit agency, operating the Edmonton Light Rail Transit (LRT) line as well as a fleet of buses. Edmonton is also looking into plans to expand LRT to the southeast and west by 2016 using low floor technology, along with a line to the Northern Alberta Institute of Technology in north-central Edmonton using the same high floor technology of the existing system by 2014. Fares are \$3.20 (2013) or a 10 ticket pass is available for \$24 (2013). An ETS app is available as well as Google Maps (Transit).


Trails

There is an extensive multi-use trail system for bicycles and pedestrians throughout the city; however, most of this is within the river valley parkland system.

Roads

A largely gridded system forms most of Edmonton's street and road network. The address system is mostly numbered, with streets running south to north and avenues running east to west. In built-up areas built since the 1950s, local streets and major roadways generally do not conform to the grid system. Major roadways include Yellowhead Trail (Highway 16), Whitemud Drive and Anthony Henday Drive, and the city is connected to other communities elsewhere in Alberta, British Columbia, and Saskatchewan via the Yellowhead Highway to the west and east and the Queen Elizabeth II Highway (Alberta Highway 2) to the south.
